

The Online Together Project:

What is it?

It is the launch of a new project designed to tackle online hate by encouraging conversation between parents/carers and children. The initiative has been launched by Samsung and Internet Matters and is an interactive question-based tool that offers advice and aims to open up conversations about online hate, such as racism, homophobia and sexism.



The first phase focuses on breaking down gender stereotypes with content reviewed and supported by teachers and experts with Global Diversity Practice's endorsement. The second phase focuses on tackling online hate with all content reviewed by online safety experts and support from Stop Hate UK.
