
Our 4 Rs...

Mrs Fazilleau Associate Assistant Headteacher


I am delighted to be joining the SLT as an Associate Assistant Headteacher alongside my role as Curriculum Leader for Languages.

Site visit to Charterhouse Restoration

Two groups of Year 10 Construction students were taken on a site visit to see the restoration of The Charterhouse in Coventry.

The work is being carried out by Splitlath Building Conservation on behalf of Historic Coventry and the visits provided a unique opportunity for our students to see some of the skills required and career possibilities in the work of preserving and re-purposing a building that is an important part of Coventry's heritage.

The itinerary for the morning included a tour of the interior of the building focusing on craft skills used to repair and renovate the existing structure. A look at how the working site is made secure with regard to health and safety of the general public, including authorised visitors and construction personnel followed by an informal session when students were be able to talk to some of the tradespeople on site about their individual specialisms.
