Though out these lessons and across the wider school we aim to help you develop greater spiritual, moral, cultural and social awareness and understanding (SMSC) alongside skills and knowledge to help you, not just to understand, but to thrive in the wider world.

You will explore cultural diversity, global concerns, justice and the law, equality including your rights and responsibilities, promoting and supporting physical and mental health, awareness of local and global issues, how to participate in politics, careers, relationships, finance and personal safety.
